

- 1. Participation is a privilege, not a right.
- 2. Use or possession of alcohol, tobacco, vaping devices, e-cigarettes, or illegal drugs means expulsion of that sport season.
- 3. Displays of poor sportsmanship, obscene gestures, or language, fighting (as the aggressor) means either a warning, benching, or suspension from the activity, depending on the severity of the incident.
- 4. Two failing deficiencies at the end of each marking period means academic probation for two weeks. The student may continue to practice but may not participate in any contests for the two-week period. At the end of the probationary period, if the student is passing the required number of classes, they may resume full participation. If the student is still failing two or more subjects, they will become ineligible until the next academic checkpoint.
- 5. If fall sports practice starts before the first day of school, a student will not be prevented from participating in that sport.
- 6. Participants must ride the team bus to and from games/scrimmages. A parent or guardian must personally notify the coach to transport their child home from an away contest.
- 7. For a student to ride home with parents of teammates, a written parental note must be provided to the athletic director prior to the contest.
- 8. If it is necessary for a student to drive to an away contest, written parental note must be turned into the main office(superintendent) prior to the contest.
- 9. Participants will pay for the cost of lost uniforms or equipment assigned to them by the coach.
- 10. Absence the day of the game: Participants must be in school before 11:30AM on the day of the contest to participate, unless previously excused from school for a commitment (medical, dental, college business, or at the discretion of the superintendent).
- 11. Absence the day after the game: Participants who are chronically absent or late to school the day after a contest will be disciplined or may be suspended from their next contest.
- 12. Students and parents/guardians must clearly understand that students are risking personal injury, paralysis or even death while participating in extracurricular activity.
- 13. Athletes represent our school. Any acts of conduct that reflect negatively on the school, students, or community will go before an athletic committee that consists of the coach, athletic director, and superintendent. Possible suspensions could follow the committee hearing.
- 14. Note: This contract is null and void after completion of the sport season.
