

Alumni Scholarship Eligibility

- 1. The applicant must be the son or daughter of a graduate of Chazy Central Rural School who is a member of the Chazy Alumni Association.
- 2. The parent/guardian must be a paid member of the Chazy Alumni Association for the preceding three years prior to and the year of the applicant's graduation. All dues must be paid by December 31 of those four years.
- 3. The applicant must be a graduating senior of Chazy Central Rural School who meets all requirements for graduation.
- 4. Applicant must plan to attend an institute of higher learning full-time.
- 5. Applicant must submit the application for the Chazy Alumni Scholarship by the deadline date, which is the second Friday of May, before 3:15 p.m. to the school guidance office.
- 6. The voting board of the Chazy Alumni Association will determine the amount of the scholarship annually. All decisions of the Chazy Alumni Association are final.
- 7. Payment of the scholarship will be made after the recipient has successfully completed his/her first semester of college and verifies that he/she has enrolled for a second semester of college. A copy of their transcript, verification of classes enrolled in, or copy of the invoice for the upcoming semester must be forwarded to the Treasurer of the Alumni Association by January 31.
- 8. Three letters of reference are required.
